

#### DROPPING OFF AND PICKING UP YOUR CHILD AT SCHOOL

We have some <u>serious safety concerns</u> about the dropping off and picking up of children at school. We have observed parents/guardians parking directly in front of both sides, and on top of the crosswalks in front of our school. We have also observed illegal parking on street corners, in the alley and in front of neighbourhood driveways. There is also continuous dropping off and picking up students in the staff parking lots.

This creates a very serious safety hazard for our students and parents trying to use the crosswalks. This is also a safety hazard as students and parents are walking through the parking lots rather than going around to use the sidewalks, as staff are leaving at the end of the day.

We ask that all parents/guardians observe the "no parking areas" around the school, including the crosswalks and alley to the east of our school. The east and west parking lots are for staff only and not to be used for picking up and dropping off of students. This year we have already had one accident occur due to congestion, people blocking lanes and blocking the bus drop off.

We have requested an increase of LRPS presence during busy times at the school to support our request for safer practices with respect to dropping off and picking up students. If you witness unsafe practices, we encourage you to phone the police service complaint line at 403-328-4444 to share what you observed.

We understand that school parking can be frustrating and is limited. We suggest parking on the westside of our field along the fence where there is lots of room for vehicles. We are doing our best to keep our students and everyone safe and hope we can ask our parents/guardians to observe traffic rules to support us.

Thank-you so much for putting student safety first.




## Mahavira Jayanti (Jain)

April 4- This day celebrates the birthday of Lord Mahavira who was the 24th leader of the Jain religion and born around 599 B.C.

April 5- It is a national holiday when \frac{1}{2} family graves are visited to ask the blessings of the departed spirits.






### Pesach/Passover (Jewish)

April 5-13- Begin previous sundown at 6pm, Pesach lasts for eight days. This time commemorates the Exodus of the Israelites from Egypt. It begins with a ritual meal 'Seder' when no leavened bread is consumed with special prayers and symbolic foods.

## Good Friday (Christian)

April 7- This day commemorates the passion and death by crucifixion of Jesus and is a solemn day. Italian Catholics have a procession called the Way of the Cross.

## Baisakhi (Sikh and Hindu)

April 14- The first day of the solar year, this is an agricultural festival celebrating the harvest, especially in North India. Tamils and Sri Lankans celebrate their New Year on this day. In Kerala, South India this day is called Vishu. Especially important to the Sikhs, it marks this day in 1699, when the tenth Guru, Guru Gobind Singh, established the order of 'Khalsa'. The festival is a mixture of feasting, dancing and worship.



## Laylat al-Qadr (Islam)

April 18- Night of Power, commemorates the revelation of the Qur'an to Prophet Muhammad in 610 CE. It begins the previous evening.

## Eid-ul-Fitr (Islam)


April 22- This marks the end of the Ramadan fast and is celebrated for 3 days. Date of observance may vary according to sighting of the new moon. Dates vary by a day depending on whether the Saudi Arabia or the North American Calendar is being observed. This calendar follows the North American dates, which are a day later.





# Gathering of Nations Pow Wow (Indigenous, USA)

April 27-29- Albuquerque, New Mexico is the venue of over 700 tribes and nations participating in a three-day event where over 3,000 participants share, teach and exchange traditions with each other.



## Showa no hi (Japan)



April 29- An annual holiday, it honors the birthday of Emperor Showa (Hirohito), the reigning Emperor before, during, and after World War II (from 1926 to 1989). The official purpose of the holiday is "To reflect on Japan's Showa period when recovery was made after turbulent days, and to think of the country's future."
